## Tributes to yachting journalist and author Peter Cumberlidge

Yachting journalist and author Peter Cumberlidge has died aged 67 from cancer.

He was a regular contributor to Practical Boat Owner and sister publications, Yachting Monthly, Yachting World and Motor Boat and Yachting.

Born in 1951 in
Leytonstone, Peter learnt to
sail on the River Dart after his
family moved to Dartmouth in
1960. He crewed on larger
sailing boats and undertook
delivery trips before jointly
buying a 1936 wooden gaff
cutter, Stormalong, with his
father in 1972.

Peter cruised extensively, sailing to North Brittany and the Channel Islands, through the French canals to the Mediterranean, through the Dutch canals to Denmark, across to north-west Spain and regularly down the Biscay coast of France.

Peter always wanted to write and became a full-time travel writer and photographer in 1983, working initially for both Yachting Monthly and PBO. He passed on his knowledge and love of cruising to at thousands of people through his journalism and the pilot,

technical and electronic handbooks he wrote. His first pilot book was *Bristol* Channel and Sevem Pilot, published in 1988 by Stanford Maritime. He also worked with Imray and Nautical. Other titles included North Brittany and Channel Islands Cruising Companion and Secret Anchorages of Brittany.

PBO features editor, Ali Wood said Peter was, "a great writer and true professional. His work was word perfect and he always went the extra mile to help out. He'll be sorely missed."

Peter was also a member of the Royal Cruising Club (RCC), serving as vice commodore from 2006 to 2010. Friend and former RCC commodore, Nigel Wollen said: "I will always be grateful for his help and support. He never felt able to become commodore due to time constraints, but is widely regarded as the best commodore we never had."
